COOPERATION AGREEMENT

**École Polytechnique
(l'X – France)**

and

**Mathematical Grammar School
(Matematička gimnazija – Serbia)**

Introduction

École Polytechnique (l'X), Route de Saclay, 91128 PALAISEAU (FRANCE), represented by its President, Mr Eric Labaye;

and

Mathematical Grammar School (Matematička gimnazija), Kraljice Natalije 37, 11000 Beograd (SERBIA), represented by its principal, Ms Mirjana Katić;

hereby conclude this agreement to develop and promote their cooperation in the field of education.

Preamble

École Polytechnique and Mathematical Grammar School seek to increase educational opportunities and promote international and inter-cultural understanding.

Article 1 – Fields of cooperation

Given the reputation and academic excellence of Mathematical Grammar School, École Polytechnique is willing to facilitate the access to its program to talented students, especially the English taught Bachelor program.

Article 2 – Prerequisites for selection

Mathematical Grammar School will select its own students on the basis of merit and other non-discriminatory eligibility criteria. Pre-selected students will have to meet the admission requirements of the Bachelor program.

Article 3 – Fast Track admission procedure

In order to facilitate the access to the Bachelor program, the two institutions agree on the following:

- Mathematical Grammar School will select at most five (5) students per year and send a list of nominees to École Polytechnique at the end of every application round, if there're any candidates. The final number of nominated students should not exceed five (5) students per year.

- Once this list is received, École Polytechnique undertakes to allow all the nominated students to take the oral interview without prior examination of their application file. Students should however complete the online admission application.

The number of students may be increased each year. An official request must be made by Mathematical Grammar School before the start of the first wave of admission in early September of each year.

Article 3 – General terms and conditions

No prior budget of expenditure is globally established. Financial aspects will be considered for each activity. Each party shall exert reasonable efforts to provide funds as and when required for the execution of the activities.

Each institution will appoint a Coordinator to manage the terms of the agreement.

Both parties will endeavour to make only appropriate use of logos, trademarks and seal of both institutions. Each party must not use the name or logo of its partner without prior consent from them insofar as this use is not directly related to the implementation of the present agreement.

Both parties to the agreement will consult each other whenever they feel it is necessary and will meet whenever necessary to discuss possible development of the programme. Differences in the interpretation of this agreement shall be settled in the most cordial manner by finding a compromise acceptable to both institutions.

Changes to this agreement can only be made with the written consent of both parties. Notice should be given at least six (6) months in advance for general modifications. For ongoing programmes, all commitments must be respected until the end of the programme.

This agreement comes into immediate effect from the date of the last signature. It will remain valid for a period of three (3) years from the date of the last signature.

This agreement may be terminated, with a six-month (6 months) period of notice, by either party. In such cases the commitments already made must be honoured.

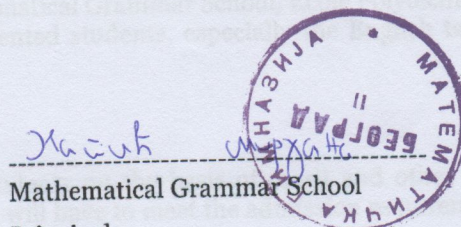
